On March 15, 2020, International Journal of Biological Sciences published a special issue entitled "The global battle against SARS-CoV-2 and COVID-19" edited by the Editor-in Chief, Prof. Chuxia DENG. Of 11 reports, 9 were contributed by doctors and scientists in Macau. Dr. lek Long LO and colleagues of the Centro Hospitalar Conde de São Januário (Shan-Din Hospital) reported their experience on the evaluation of SARS-CoV-2 RNA shedding in clinical specimens and clinical features of all 10 patients in Macau, and recommended the assessment of both fecal and respiratory specimens for enhancing diagnostic sensitivity [3]. Prof. Xin CHEN and his colleagues of ICMS, UM indicated that greater than 85% of COVID-19 patients in China have been receiving Traditional Chinese Medicine (TCM) treatment, and presented the clinical evidence showing the beneficial effect of TCM in the treatment of the patients [4]. Professors Jun ZHENG [1], Qi ZHAO [5], Hanming SHEN [6], Yutao XIANG [7, 8, 9], Renhe XU [11] and their team members shared their understanding of SARS-CoV-2 and COVID-19 from various aspects and brought up comprehensive reviews on what we have learned and to be learned about the virus and the disease.

Also, a team led by Prof. Dong-Yan JIN of the University of Hong Kong overviewed the existing knowledge about 7 human coronavirus (HCoVs), with a focus on the history of their discovery as well as their zoonotic origins and interspecies transmission; and a team led by doctors Wen-Tian LI and Yi LI of the Wuhan Mental Health Center reported their epidemiological survey involving 6,910 residents in China [10].
